Temperatures are average for the cities listed, and note that inland temperatures will be lower than coastal. E.g. Tromsø is further north than Rovaniemi, but Tromsø is coastal.

On days that indicate very short time of actual sunlight, it is important to note that as the sun trajectory is fairly flat there is a long dawn and a long dusk. The actual time of daylight hours, therefore, is considerably longer.

your holiday is well planned, the answer is often yes. However, most people will appreciate that the Aurora is a natural phenomena, and ocations at the right time. This may mean allowing for common weather patterns, and/or travelling either inland or out to the coast. It nearly Ilways means getting you out of populated areas with light pollution, and into the exotic wilderness with plenty of great daytime activities to Juarantee a memorable experience!

WHEN TO GO?

The period between November and March is generally the best time to see the Northern Lights. However, they can also be seen in late September, October and early April. Other times of year there is not enough darkness. October and November tend to see a lot of windy and wet weather, which of course means cloud cover and less chance to see the lights. Our favourite months are mid January, February & March, which means plenty of darkness in the peak viewing period between 6pm and midnight, and plenty of daylight to enjoy other winter activities.

WHAT ARE THE NORTHERN LIGHTS?

The ultimate energy source of the aurora is the solar wind flowing past Earth and touching its magnetic field. Aurora starts when explosions in the sun send off particles into space. These particles are charged and form the solar wind. When solar wind hits Earth's magnetic field in the Polar areas where the magnetic shield is less powerful, it collides with particles in our atmosphere creating electricity and light. It is this light that we see as the Northern Light or Aurora Borealis.

The Aurora awed the ancient people. Aurora was the Roman goddess of the dawn. Boreas is a Greek word for the north wind - thus, the northern lights. The Finnish word for the lights, 'revontulet', comes from a Sami legend where the tail of a fox running on along the snow covered fells strikes the snow drifts and sends a trail of sparks high up to the sky. Revontulet literally means foxfires. The Vikings believed that the Aurora was a beautiful maiden called Valkyrias who escorted those killed in battle to the gods. The Sami people of Lapland also believed they had power over the lights, and whistling under them would cause them to come closer. Many ancient people would not stare at or speak of them, due to a fear of insulting their divinity.

TROMSØ & LYNGEN ALPS

- independent

Tromsø is the gateway to the Arctic and is located in the middle of the Aurora Borealis zone. Following the planet's rotation, Tromsø moves into the aurora zone around 6 pm to midnight. Just east of Tromsø lies the Lyngen Alps where you will stay in a traditional timber lodge, beautifully situated on the fjord.

This is a perfect and tranquil place to observe the Northern Lights, combined with daytime activities such as dogsledding, snow scooter riding, skiing or a photography course.

Day 1: Arrive Tromsø – Gateway to the Arctic





Day 4: Snowmobile safari & a night in a snow igloo

The first highlight of the day awaits upon your arrival to Sorrisniva Igloo Hotel: a snowmobile safari through the spectacular wilderness. Dinner is served in a beautiful Sàmi lavvo-shaped wooden restaurant before a magical night in an ice and snow room.

STAYING IN AN ICE or SNOW ROOM

There are several opportunities to experience a night in an ice or snow room during your trip to the far north. The Kirkenes Snow Hotel, the Sorrisniva Igloo Hotel in Alta and ICEHOTEL in Jukkasjärvi are all set up as 'hotels'. Other resorts offer simpler freestanding igloos alongside their more traditional accommodation.

Generally, the entire exterior and interior is made of snow and ice including the beds, tables and internal features. They typically have a bar and/or restaurant attached – some made of ice, others are traditional wooden structures providing a cosy atmosphere with open fires. Ice chapels are also built within the

Generally, the temperature inside the rooms remains constant at minus 4-7 degrees Celsius. Depending on your location, reindeer hides, balaclavas, thermal mattresses and sleeping bags will keep you warm, and ensure you will have a comfortable night. You still might feel the chill of the night, however, adjacent to the cold rooms are lounge areas with facilities, showers, and in some locations, a sauna to warm up in. Warm drinks are provided in the morning.

TROMSØ, ORCAS & HUSKIES - independent

Experience the incredible wilderness of Norway, have fun commanding your own husky team and take in the amazing beauty of the Norwegian coast. Join a whale watching tour to observe orcas, humpback and fin whales in the inlets around Sommarøy.

Day 1: Welcome to Tromsø, the capital of the Arctic

Tromsø is a city packed with culture, polar history and fresh locally sourced food in its numerous restaurants. Mountains, fjords and islands also surround it; making it a great base for exploring the winter landscape.

Day 2: Tromsø & Northern Lights

After breakfast, explore Tromsø on a walking tour including a visit to the Polar Museum. In the evening join a guided Aurora Chase by minibus, led by an experienced local guide.

Day 3: Day of Dogsledding

Leave the city and mush your own sled, pulled by a happy team of experienced huskies. Drive through the breath-taking snowcovered landscape with incredible ocean views. In the afternoon transfer to Arctic Hotel Sommarøy.

Day 4: Explore Sommarøy

Explore this vibrant and traditional coastal community where fishing is still a principal activity. Join a fishing trip, go kayaking or walk along the white sandy beaches.

Day 5: Whale-watching

During the months of November and December, join a whalewatching tour with excellent opportunities to observe orcas, humpback and fin whales. In the afternoon return to Tromsø.

Day 6: Depart Tromsø

AURORA SAFARI IN SWEDISH LAPLAND - independent

Stay overnight at Aurora Safari Camp in the absolute wild forest of Swedish Lapland. Sleep above the snow covered landscape at Treehotel, in an ICE-room at ICEHOTEL and then enjoy the Abisko Sky Station. This trip has been designed to serve you the highlights of Aurora watching in far northern Sweden, coupled with staying at some of the most amazing accommodation you will ever encounter.

Day 1: Aurora Safari Camp

Arrive Luleå and transfer to the Aurora Safari Camp. Stay overnight in Lavvu tents with comfort in the absolute wild forest of Swedish Lapland and Råne River Valley.

Day 2: Dogsledding & camp fire at unique Lavvu camp

Snowshoe trekking, dogsledding, snowmobile safaris, wildlife trekking, ice fishing are available for you to enjoy here at camp. Being away from artificial-light, this camp is a perfect spot for watching the Aurora Borealis

Day 3: Stay at Treehotel above the Swedish forests

Transfer to Treehotel, a unique hotel experience: treerooms with contemporary design in the middle of unspoilt nature.

Day 4: Snow mobile safari at the Treehotel

After breakfast we will take you on an exhilarating snow mobile safari. Riding a snowmobile through a beautiful winter landscape is a liberating feeling, just like surfing or riding a motorbike. Tree saunas, ice fishing and horse riding are options for the afternoon.

Day 5: Overnight in ICEHOTEL

Transfer to the Boden train station and enjoy the efficient train services in Sweden as you travel to Kiruna. Transfer to ICEHOTEL and settle into your ICE room (cold) for one night.

Day 6: Wake up surrounded by ice and then train to Abisko

Return to Kiruna and board the train. The train ride takes you through the inland winter landscape of northern Sweden along the majestic Torneträsk, the fifth largest lake in Sweden, where we stop at Abisko.

Day 7: Aurora Sky Station

The day is free in Abisko to enjoy optional activities such as visiting a Sámi lavvu, go snowshoeing or ice fishing. You can also enjoy a traditional Swedish sauna down by the lake. After your evening meal, enjoy a night visit to the Aurora Sky Station.

Day 8: Depart Abisko

After breakfast, depart Abisko by train to Kiruna, or travel on to Narvik on the Norwegian side of the border. Transfers not included.

ICE & AURORAS IN SWEDISH LAPLAND - independent

The original ICEHOTEL is located 200 km inside the Arctic Circle, in the little village of Jukkasjärvi. As soon as winter takes hold, a team of experienced snow builders, architects, designers and artists from all over the world gather to create each year's unique version of ICEHOTEL. On average 2000 tons of ice and 30,000 tons of snow are used building this monument of art, architecture and craftsmanship.

Abisko, in the middle of the Aurora zone, is considered to be one of best places to see the Aurora Borealis. A visit to the Aurora Sky Station, accessible only by a chairlift high up above the lights of the village, allows you a great chance to experience the Northern Lights.

Day 1: Arrive for an Aurora Hunt

Upon arrival in Kiruna, transfer to ICEHOTEL. In the evening, dress warmly for a snowmobile excursion in search of Northern Lights. Dinner included at a wilderness camp. Overnight in a warm hotel room or cabin.

Day 2: Dogsledding and Overnight in ICEHOTEL

Start the day with a dog sled journey across the snowy landscape to a wilderness camp, followed by lunch. Afterwards ride back to the kennel to learn more about these working dogs and their daily life. Be brave and overnight in an ice room. Sleep in thermal sleeping bags laid out on reindeer skins on a special bed made of snow and ice. An unforgettable night!

Day 3-4: Abisko & the Aurora Zone

After breakfast transfer to Kiruna train station for an hour's train ride to Abisko. In the evening visit the Aurora Sky Station for a night to remember.

Day 4 is free to join optional activities such as visiting a Sàmi lavvu, snow shoeing or reindeer sledding.

Day 5: Depart Kiruna

After breakfast, depart by train back to Kiruna for your departure.

Our Nordic Winter Odyssey is designed to optimise the chances to see the Aurora Borealis. It travels from Oslo, over the North Cape, through the Lyngen Alps, to Tromsø and Swedish Lapland and down to Stockholm.

You stay at boutique hotels such as Lyngen Lodge and ICEHOTEL, and use various modes of transport taking you through a fairy-tale winter landscape. During this 'odyssey' you have access to all the activities that make chasing the Aurora Borealis so wonderful.

Day 1 & 2: Oslo

Osio is a wonderful winter city with lots of winter lights, museums and cosy coffee shops to visit. Unique restaurants and design shops, Oslo has plenty to offer in winter.

Day 3: Fly to Kirkenes

Make your way to Oslo airport for a 2-hour flight to Kirkenes.

Day 4 & 5: Travel south on the Coastal voyage over the North Cape Board the Hurtigruten ship for an overnight voyage over the top of Norway and the beautiful North Norwegian coast. Arrive Skjervøy in the evening of the day 5 and transfer to your base in the Lyngen Alps.

Day 6 & 7: Lyngen Alps

Your lodge sits in a natural forest clearing above the Lyngsfjord with a striking mountain backdrop. High in the Arctic Circle, it is as remote a spot as you could hope to find, and a place to enjoy nature and snow activities. Under the guidance and instruction from your guide you will learn to mush your own dog team through the forested glacial valleys close to Finland.

Day 8: Tromsø

After breakfast transfer by road to Tromsø for a free afternoon to explore the Arctic Capital.

Day 9: Travel to Abisko

Take the fast boat south to Harstad, or bus to Narvik, and continue by car or train to Abisko in Sweden (schedule depends on weekday). Enjoy a night visit to the Aurora Sky Station in the evening.

Day 10: Winter activities in Abisko

The day is free in Abisko to enjoy optional activities such as visiting a Sámi lavvu, go snowshoeing or ice fishing. You can also enjoy a traditional Swedish sauna down by the lake.

Day 11 & 12: ICEHOTEL - a night to remember

Take the morning train to Kiruna and transfer to ICEHOTEL in the tiny village of Jukkasjärvi. You will enjoy one night in a warm room in the hotel, followed by a night in an ice room. Inside ICEHOTEL, the temperature is never colder than -5 to -8 °C, regardless how cold it may be outside. In the evening of day 11 we depart on a guided snowmobile excursion in search of the Northern Lights.

On day 12 handle and drive your own reindeer with a sled through the wintry pristine forests. Enjoy a Sámi lunch in a traditional tent.

Day 13 & 14: Stockholm

Transfer to the airport for your flight south to Stockholm. Day 14 is free to enjoy in Stockholm and we have included a Stockholm Card with access to several sights and free public transport.

Day: 15 Depart Stockholm







HURTIGRUTEN

Hurtigruten ships have been a staple along the Norwegian coast since 1893. The current fleet consists of 11 classic ships. The smallest ship, MS Lofoten, has a capacity of 151 beds (licensed to carry 400 passengers) and the largest and newest, MS Midnatsol, has a capacity of 638 beds (licensed to carry 1,000 passengers). When you choose your date; you choose your ship, so ask us for advice.

CLASSIC VOYAGES

The 'classic' voyages run all the way from Bergen to Kirkenes (7 days), Kirkenes to Bergen (6 days) or up and back (12 days). Travellers coming to experience the spectacular coastline of Norway more often enjoy classic voyages.

PORT-TO-PORT VOYAGES

Hurtigruten is perfect for shorter voyages. These so called port-to-port voyages are often enjoyed also by Norwegians using the ships as a ferry service along the coast, which is really what the Hurtigruten concept is designed for. The ships service 34 ports along the Norwegian coast (same ports going north and south), so that people living in these remote outposts have regular transport options in and out. All Hurtigruten ships have a wide range of comfortable cabins. They vary in size and location. As a general rule, outside cabins on the higher decks have a picture window while the ones on the lower decks have portholes.

Most travel brochures use the entry level N-class cabins as the cabin of choice. These are about 7-13 m², and more often do not comfortably fit two regular large suitcases. Especially on longer voyages, we will always recommend you to spend the \$40- \$70 extra per night and upgrade to a P-class, or better even, a U-class cabin. A bit more space for comfort and enjoyment!

SEASONALITY & PRICING

Travelling along the Norwegian coast is spectacular in all seasons, even the Autumn storms in November are an experience with whales migrating up the coast. Winter, from December to mid April, is great for the Northern Lights and enjoying winter landscapes. Spring, summer and early/mid autumn, from mid April to October offers spring blossom, long light days of Scandinavian summer and magnificent autumn colours.

From 01 Jun to 31 Aug the Hurtigruten voyage north from Bergen includes a side trip into the infamous Geirangerfjord, while from 01 Sep to 31 Oct the side trip takes you into the Hjørundfjord. On the southbound voyage from 01 Apr to 31 May Hurtigruten sails into Lyngenfjorden from the east side of the mountain range "Lyngen Alps" offering spectacular views of towering cliffs and mountains. On select dates in Jan, Feb, Mar, Sep, Oct and Nov, there are Northern Lights Astronomy Voyages with added Astronomy lectures and a visit to the Northern Lights Planetarium.

Seasonal pricing varies from winter, spring, summer and autumn. Winter; Nov, Dec, Jan, Feb & Mar is low season, and prices are good. Spring; Apr & May is a popular time and is shoulder/high season. Summer; Jun, Jul & Aug is high season with prices approx. 50% higher than in low season. Autumn; Sep & Oct is shoulder season. A voyage starting in Bergen on 01 April can be 25-30% higher than starting 31 Mar, so ring us and we will talk you through the best options.

LIFE ON BOARD

Each ship has a different style and design. All ships have comfortable lounges and plenty of deck space offering perfect panoramic views of the world's most beautiful coastal scenery. The onboard cuisine is influenced by the traditional dishes of the region and the different seasons. Being on the coastal voyage, seafood is often on the menu and each dinner ends with delicious traditional desserts. Breakfast and lunch are varied buffets. The restaurants are fully licensed, however, alcohol is taxed heavily in Norway so be warned. All of the ships have a small library where you can relax reading a book, and a café serving drinks and snacks 24 hours a day. Most ships also have Jacuzzis out on deck and a fitness room available. During the winter months, an added service provided is a wake up call which alerts you if the Aurora Borealis makes an appearance.

FARLY BIRDS

East Greenland is probably the most isolated part of this great island. It is also where old traditions are still very much upheld. In winter hunting and ice fishing are a part of the way of life and dog sledges are widely used to get around. Dogsledding is a great way to experience both the magnificent landscape and nature of this isolated area and to get a feel for the traditional arctic way of life. On this adventure we will set out from Tasiilaq for a tour of the Ammassalik Island. Visit the Sermilik Ice Fjord and experience the small settlement of Tiniteqilaaq where we will dine with a local family. This adventure takes you deep into the arctic world of East Greenland.

Day 1: Reykjavík, Kulusuk & Tasiilaq

Meet at Reykjavík airport for the 2-hour flight to Kulusuk, followed by a helicopter ride to Tasiilaq on Ammassalik Island. Free evening in Tasiilaq and overnight in a guesthouse.

Day 2: Tasiilaq & the Sermilik Coast

Meet the dog teams in the outskirts of Tasiilaq for a briefing. With two people per sled, we head north over King Oscar Fjord and up to the big lake Qordlortq, before the dogs pull us up to an altitude of 500 m with a spectacular view over the Sermilik Ice Fjord. Overnight in huts for two nights with a sleeping bag. Dogsledding: 6 hours total

Day 3: Snowshoe Adventure up a peak with a view

With snow shoes on, we will venture up onto a close by peak, in an attempt to get a superb view of the great Greenland Icecap across the fjord on the horizon. Snow shoeing: 4-6 hours

Day 4: The village of Tiniteqilaaq

After breakfast, we pack up our sleds and head along the coast towards the small settlement of Tiniteqilaaq. We explore the village and get some insight into the Inuit way of life in these harsh arctic conditions. We will spend the night in sleeping bags at a house with basic facilities. Dinner is served with a local family. Dogsledding: 4 hours

Day 5: Pitserpaajik

Today we travel over the strait that separates Tiniteqilaaq and Ammassalik Island and turn east following one of the most beautiful riverbed rides on the island. Our route takes us over a fjord and all the way down to Pitserpaajik peninsula where a hut awaits us. Dogsledding: 6 hours

Day 6: Pitserpaajik to Tasiilag

From the Pitserpaajik peninsula we head west straight trough Ammassalik Island until we reach Tasiilaq. After saying goodbye to the dog teams you are transferred back to your guesthouse. Dogsledding: 6 hours

Day 7: Tasiilaq

We have a free day to explore the town of Tasiilaq or go for an optional tour on snowshoes to the valley of Flowers in its winter coat. Overnight at a guesthouse.

Day 8: Return to Reykjavik

We transfer to Kulusuk and board our flight back to Reykjavík where the tour ends at the airport.



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WINTER CLOTHING & PRACTICAL INFO

CLOTHING & WEATHER

In Scandinavia, Iceland and Finland the winters are long and cold with large amounts of snow in the north. Temperatures and snow conditions vary significantly from south to north and from coast to inland. The coldest temperatures and often also the clearest skies are found inland and far to the north.

That said; far north is exactly where you are heading, so with temperatures well below freezing it is important to be well prepared. There is a local saying that loosely translates to "There is no bad weather, just bad clothing". This is the ultimate tip that assists locals and visitors alike through the northern winter with its famous sub zero temperatures.

As a rule of thumb, it is important always to keep your head and neck covered and feet and hands warm. Make sure to have a pair of good winter boots that have a non-slippery sole. A warm winter jacket, gloves, hat, scarf, warm socks and thermal underwear will see you through the most extreme weather.

The largest investment if you normally live in the southern hemisphere is a pair of warm boots. We strongly recommend that you do invest in, or borrow, some nice warm winter or snow boots, as that will ensure you have an enjoyable holiday rather than always being cold. Your boots need to be sizable enough to fit two pairs of thick, warm socks.

Your travel documents will provide further guidance on what to wear in order to fully enjoy your holiday!



YOUR CLOTHING - these four layers are what you should aim for when you are packing:

- 1 Underwear: "Breathable" material, e.g. long-sleeved and long-legged thermal underwear and cotton socks worn under woollen socks.
- 2 Trousers and shirts: loose-fitting, fleece, cotton or similar, high collar.
- 3 Thick woollen scarf, thick jumper and lined and windproof pants.
- 4 Winter jacket, hat, balaclava gloves and mittens and winter shoes.



AIRPORTS & TRANSFERS

Flying in the Nordic region during winter is safe and convenient. Winter conditions do not prevent the ability to fly or land. As winter conditions in the far north are nothing unusual airports are well prepared, and de-icing equipment is readily available. The industry is well regulated, planes safe and pilots very experienced in flying in all weather.

There is no airport in Scandinavia without a convenient public transport connection to the nearest city. Your travel documents contain instructions and options that guide you straight to where you need to go — with or without a pre-booked transfer. Our fellow countrymen speak English and are very happy to help you at any stage.

We can organise a private transfer in most of the locations if this is your preference.

IS WINTER CLOTHING PROVIDED OR CAN I RENT?

It's recommended that you purchase or borrow inner layer clothing. Renting clothes when you arrive at your destination could mean that you don't get your preferred choice. There are generally few options, if any, for renting winter clothing unless you are taking part in an activity. All larger towns will have very good winter clothing for sale. On some of our daytrips ϑ overnight trips outer layers are provided or available for rent. Please ask us for details as you book as to which trips provide outer clothing.

SCANDINAVIAN BUILDING STANDARDS

All houses and major structures are built to withstand cold temperatures and you will never be cold inside. Those layers of clothing will be shed within minutes of entering any Scandinavian structure. Most cabins and hotels also have a good entry points with wet clothing storage areas, drying areas and boot dryers.

PRONOUNCIATIONS

How do you pronunce our special vowels? The challenge is to really distinguish them as separate vowels, and not just muddled versions of A and O.

Å (upper case) å (lower case) is used in Swedish, Danish & Norwegian. Some Danish towns use a double Aa which is still pronounced as Å.

The Å can be thought of as the 'au' sound in 'Paul' or the 'o' sound in the word "afford".

A (upper case) ä (lower case) in Swedish and Æ (upper case) æ (lower case) in Norwegian & Danish is pronounced the same. The word "hair" works well for this letter. Particularly if you try to imitate a rather posh British-English pronunciation of that word.

O (upper case) ö (lower case) in Swedish and Ø (upper case) ø (lower case) in Norwegian & Danish is pronounced the same. Think of the vowel sound in words like "bird" and "girl".

The word 'island' translated in to Swedish is the one letter Ö and Ø in Danish & Norwegian. Hence, many of our coastal cities and islands have this letter in their names.



THE FINNISH SAUNA

Imagine you are invited to take off all your clothes and go to a little room heated to almost 100 C°, where you will sit, naked, with others for a while and sweat. Then you will go outside and jump (still naked) through a small hole in the ice on a lake and refresh yourselves in the freezing water - or roll in the snow instead.

In short, "What about a sauna?"

The answer should be simple. Be courageous and say; "yes" - because if you don't you will miss a deliciously relaxing experience, which will provide a vital insight into the culture and mentality of your Finnish hosts.

DRIVING ON ICE

Ice driving lessons are offered throughout northern Finland and Sweden, the most famous, being the Juha Kankkunen Academy. Participants learn to control the car on the ice track like a true rally champion in a safe and controlled environment. Another adrenaline boosting option is gokarting through the snow. Some of the go-karting circuits are situated close to our principal properties in Finland and can easily fit into your itinerary.

HOW DO YOU PHOTOGRAPH THE NORTHERN LIGHTS?

- 1. You need a tripod and a camera with manual settings you can use.
- 2. Stick with Manual or AV for your camera modes.
- 3. You often need shutter speeds up to a minute or longer.
- 4. Try a f/2.8 lens. It'll help a lot. If the lights are really strong, you can go down to a shutter speed of around 10sec with one of these lenses.
- 5. Do all of the above using ISO around 100-400 for good results.
- 6. Clear skies and snow on the ground are ideal conditions.
