

WHEN IN TTALY

Have you ever pictured yourself in Italy? Pizza, pasta and piazze... Aperitivo, cheese and vino... Narrow winding alleyways, rolling green hills with olive groves and vineyards, ancient ruins and cultural masterpieces... and the sparkling waters of the sun-kissed Mediterranean.

Do:

- BE YOURSELF AND BE AWARE There are pickpockets targeting tourists everywhere across Italy and particularly around tourist hot spots. So, it's a good idea to blend in.
- TRY OUT A FEW ITALIAN WORDS Buongiorno, per favore, grazie, buonasera and arrivederci are all helpful greetings. 'ciao' is used willy-nilly in Italy especially by younger folk but, it is a casual greeting, so only use it when it has been used by a local first.
- STAY COOL IN SUMMER Book a hotel with A/C (or a fan) or even a villa with pool and plan to visit outdoor tourist attractions in the cooler parts of the day. Rest indoors or in a gallery, church, museum or shady park during the heat of the day.
- EAT GELATO every day, especially in summer.
- LEAVE A TIP WITH YOUR MEAL OR APERITIF Being a waiter is a respected career choice in Italy and not a casual job. 15% is usually added to your bill in restaurants, cafes and hotels to cover service charges.
- RESPECT A DIFFERENT CULTURE Wear comfortable and appropriate clothes. Italy is a Roman Catholic country and, despite what you believe, it is respectful to cover your shoulders and knees when in a church or sacred place.
- KEEP AN OPEN MIND There are lots of Italians living in a very old country with lots of visitors, every day, in their backyards so to speak. There are often crowds - people trying to enjoy their holidays and locals going about their daily lives. It's good to stay calm and be flexible. And respectful. After all, you are on holiday.
- LIVE LA DOLCE VITA Ah the sweet life. Relax and savour your Italian experience. As they say, when in Rome...

Don't:

- LOOK LIKE A TOURIST No visible bum-bags, passport neck wallets or a camera slung over your shoulder. There are far better and more stylish options available these days.
- BUY WATER BOTTLES IN ROME Buy one then use the many natural spring water fountains around the city, and other Italian cities too. You won't get sick and you will help the environment.
- DRIVE LIKE A TOURIST Italians drive assertively and don't follow the same road rules as in Australia. Be confident, stay on the right (overtake on the left) and keep calm. If there are no signs, go straight ahead until otherwise indicated. And don't forget to take out insurance on your rental car!
- EXPECT THE SAME AS HOME

Pasta is an entrée not a main meal. It's not drowned in sauce or liberally seasoned. Pizzas (thin crust) are often eaten whole. That's one per person not a share experience for the whole family. Café the Italian way. Milky lattes and cappucinos are enjoyed before 11am. Espressos are taken after meals and throughout the day, usually standing at the bar (it's cheaper too!). There is no skinny, soy, flat white, so save your special order for home. Wine (vino) is generally enjoyed with food, not on its own. Aperitivo is a pre-dinner drink, from 5pm and usually a biere or spirit mix enjoyed seated with a little (complimentary salty) snack. A liqueur like grappa or limoncello (or sambucca or Frangelico!) is taken after the meal as a digestive. Italians observe lunch as their main daily meal, take a siesta (nap) in summer during the heat of the day and eat dinner late... often walking, chatting and eating gelato in the cool of the evening. What a great idea!

• TRAVEL WITH TOO MUCH LUGGAGE There are many old cobbled streets, lots of stairs to climb and small lifts. Car boots are small, train compartments are crowded so if you want to save your back and energy, pack smart and light.

Age old traditions, awe-inspiring art and architectural masterpieces that have influenced western civilisation and the greatest number of UNESCO World Heritage sites in the world. Italy is full of cultural riches, ancient ruins and the famous names of Michelangelo, da Vinci and the Renaissance.

From pre-Roman times to the present, Italy holds the key to ancient times and civilisations, its history preserved in town centres (centro storico) and unique landscapes across the country. From Greek temples and Roman cities, Etruscan walls and Norman cathedrals, Italy is full to the brim of world famous art, architectural and historic masterpieces.

The major art cities of Rome, Venice and Florence, and many smaller towns, are open air museums full of cultural treasures and recognised heritage sites themselves.



Italian Treasures Not To Miss

- When in Rome Visit the ancient Roman Colosseum, Forum and the Pantheon, Bernini's magnificent fountains in Piazza Navona, artist Rachael's paintings and sculptures in Borghese Gallery and of course, the iconic baroque-style Trevi Fountain and Spanish Steps. And don't miss the Capitoline Wolf, a world famous bronze sculpture inspired by the founding of Rome legend and located at the Musei Capitolini.
- · Vatican City Take in the smallest city state in the world, surrounded by Rome. See St. Peter's Basilica and Square, the Vatican Museums full of ancient archives, Roman sculptures and Renaissance frescos, baroque gardens and of course, the Sistine Chapel, famous for Michelangelo's ceiling paintings including The Creation of Adam.
- Renaissance Florence is set alongside the River Arno spanned by picturesque Ponte Vecchio. It is home to Michelangelo's much loved sculpture of *David* at Galleria dell'Academia, Botticelli's Renaissance masterpiece Birth of Venus and other masterpieces in the Uffizi Gallery. Visit Brunelleschi's iconic Santa Maria del Fiore Cathedral with its magnificent green and red marble facade and the largest brick dome in the world. Don't miss the fascinating Vasari Corridor, Giotto's Florentine-Gothic style Campanile Tower and St. John's octagonal Baptistry, with its Gates of Paradise by Michelangelo, an example of Florentine Romanesque architecture and one of the oldest buildings in the city.







• Cultural wonders of Milan See Leonardo da Vinci's world famous mural, The Last Supper in the refectory of the Convent of Santa Maria della Grazie and marvel at the Duomo Cathedral, one of Italy's only examples of late Gothic architecture. And the world famous Teatro alla Scala, Milan's must visit opera house.

- Ancient Greek temples and theatres scattered across Sicily, Puglia and Calabria regions in the south.
- Norman cathedrals in Monreale, Cefalu and Palermo in Sicily.
- Etruscan architecture Walls, city gates and arches some of the best remaining examples of this pre-Roman civilisation found in Volterra and the Maremma in Tuscany and Perugia in Umbria.
- · Mosaic and fresco masterpieces found in churches, caves and ancient Roman ruins and cities across Italy, from Pompeii in Campania to the early Christian mosaics in Rome's catacombs.
- Baroque city of Lecce in Puglia in Italy's south, largely influenced by ancient Greek, Arab and Norman civilisations and a UNESCO World Heritage site.
- · Venice and its Carnevale Art city extraordinaire with its Byzantine inspired St. Mark's Basilica, Doges Palace and ornately decorated buildings and bridges. Visit the Peggy Guggenheim Collection, Venice Biennale and the famous La Fenice Theatre - an entire city full of art masterpieces including the stunning 16 foot high Renaissance painting Madonna di Ca' Pesaro by Titian.

BUON APPETITO TASTES OF ITALY

Eat and drink your way around Italy - savour Italian flavours and experience some of the world's best food and wine.

Italian food is made and eaten with love. Traditional recipes are passed on from generation to generation, eaten and enjoyed al fresco with family and friends. A celebration of seasonal produce, which pays homage to the traditional ways of eating and drinking - simple and authentic flavours, a feast for the five senses!

From north to south, the flavours of Italy are as diverse as they are famous. In **Northern Italy** rice, polenta, butter and game feature heavily due to availability of local produce and proximity to neighbouring countries with their rich mountaininspired cuisines.

The popular digestive *grappa* is from the northern Alps and has traditionally been used for all types of ailments... and perhaps also for warmth!

Turin and the Piedmont region is known for chocolate, including much loved Nutella, truffles and agnoletti pasta and home of the famous aperitifs, Campari and Martini and Rossi vermouth. It's also the birthplace of the now worldwide Slow Food movement.

From Veneto comes the magnificent Italian sparkling wine, prosecco, enjoyed on its own or in popular cocktail, the Bellini. A classic Venetian dish is risi e bisi (rice and peas) and arguably the world's favourite Italian dessert, tiramisu, is also Venetian.

In **Lombardy**, the specialties are minestrone risotto alla Milanese and hearty Osso Buco, best enjoyed with an aged local red wine like Valtellina Superiore.

The **Ligurian** region's food is all about the sea and quite distinct from the other northern regions. Pesto di Genovese, basil pesto sauce, is the region's claim to fame.

The central and southern regions of Italy have their own flavours and specialties. The food of Abruzzo and Puglia is cucina povera, peasant food, with simple seasonal ingredients cooked into hearty dishes that embody the produce of the land.

Emilia Romagna is a food lover's paradise with world famous bolognese sauce, aged balsamic vinegar, and parmigiano reggiano, real parmesan cheese found throughout the region.

When in **Tuscany**, try a famous *Florentina steak* and go wine tasting in the classic wine regions of *Chianti* and *Montepulciano*. In **Umbria**, try local delicacy, tartufo nero, black truffles, with their distinctive earthy flavour used in many dishes.

The food of the south is the soul of Italy with rustic Mediterranean flavours, rich spicy tomato sauces and almost exclusive use of olive oil in cooking. A must try dish from **Campania** is *spaghetti puttanesca*, made from olives, tomatoes, anchovies and capers, and the most loved Italian cheese of all, mozzarella di bufala, made from the milk of local water buffaloes. Sorrento is home of delicious limoncello liqueur made from abundant lemons grown along the Amalfi Coast.

Sicilian food has been influenced by diverse cultures over many centuries and is rich in the fruits of the land and sea. Best known dishes are vitello al Marsala and arancini, deep fried rice balls and sweet fortified Marsala wine from the west coast town of the same name. Sicilian sweets based on almonds include sweet pastry cannoli and cassata. Don't miss Sicilian ice cream, or granita, enjoyed at any time of the day.

The Island of Sardinia has its own flavours and even a liqueur of its own. Mirto, made from local berries is best enjoyed after a full Sardinian feast.
