The south of Italy is from Campania to the toe of Italy's boot in Calabria, including the lesser known regions of Basilicata and Puglia and its many well known islands, both big (Sicily and Sardinia) and small (Aeolian, Capri and Ischia). From Rome, head south to bustling Naples, home of the pizza and gateway to the beautiful region of Campania with its picture perfect Amalfi Coast and spectacular seaside towns of Sorrento, Positano, Praiano, Ravello, Salerno and the enchanting islands of Capri and Ischia off the coast.

South of Campania lies the less discovered southern regions, Italy's boot heel, Puglia and toe, Calabria and Basilicata in between.

The **Basilicata** region boasts two coastlines, mountain ranges, dark forested valleys and villages melded to rugged rockfaces. Its location is remote yet strategic, linking ancient Rome to the eastern Byzantine empire. Over time it has been successively invaded, pillaged, plundered, abandoned and neglected. Today, its star attraction is undoubtedly Matera with its famous sassi, former ancient cave dwellings. Maratea is surprisingly one of Italy's most chic seaside resorts and **Potenza**, its capital, is a major transport hub connecting neighbouring regions by rail and road.

The region of **Puglia**, with its kilometres of spectacular Adriatic Sea coastline, is the real Italy - less tourists, unique cultural treasures of its own and amazing regional food and wine. Its famous round trulli are both mysterious and distinctive of this region.

The southern most region is **Calabria**, separated from Sicily by the Strait of Messina. This is sun-baked, Italian Mafia country and for travellers, an adventure into the unknown. Rich in rugged natural landscapes, stunning coastline and beaches and lapped by the splendid crystal blue Ionian and Tyrrhenian seas. Experience the full flavours of the south; discover pretty coastal Tropea with its lanes and piazzas and the coast of the gods in Vibo Valentia.

Venture even further south to find Italy's largest island, Sicily. This unique land has volcanoes (some active), archaeological sites, magnificent white sandy beaches and spectacular scenery, with its own cosmopolitan culture built from many influences over time. And last, but certainly not least, don't miss Sardinia and the Aeolian Islands off the coast of southern Italy.

The food of the south is the soul of Italy, with its rich spicy tomato sauces and almost exclusive use of olive oil in cooking. The south is home to citrus fruits, fields of durum wheat, olive groves and vineyards. Seafood is in abundance from tuna to anchovies, from clams to sea urchins. There is so much to love about Southern Italy.

### **Getting There**

The southern regions are easily accessible by car, rail, bus or on a small escorted or self drive tour showcasing the best of each area including food and wine! Travel to Sicily by rail, car ferry or domestic air from Reggio di Calabria or from Genoa or Naples and Palermo.

Sun, sea, sand - and a hint of the exotic: Sicily teeters on the edge of Europe and its flavours are tinged with the culinary heritage of North Africa.

Moorish invaders introduced spices such as cloves, cinnamon, nutmeg and saffron along with citrus fruits to the island. The Byzantines, Romans, Greeks and Spanish also left their mark on the architecture and cuisine.

This tour explores Sicily's south east, surrounded by the crumbling grandeur of historical sites such as Siracusa's Greek Theatre and the baroque towns of Noto and Ragusa - and within easy reach of some of the region's best local produce.

Nearby Avola produces almonds, Ragusa wine, Caciocavallo cheese and Pachino, sweet, ripe, cherry tomatoes. Fresh fish is, of course, a highlight of this Mediterranean island: think grilled swordfish, tuna and anchovies along with regional specialties such as spaghetti con le sarde (a sardine and pasta dish) and pasta con le sarde e finnochio (with fennel).

Then there's sheep's milk ricotta, also used to make one of Sicily's signature sweets: cannoli are fried pastries stuffed with sweet ricotta and sugar and dipped in chocolate. The island is famous for its sweets: cassata is a delicious ice cream dish while granita, a semi-frozen dessert, was invented here.

Staying in a gorgeous old 19th century farmhouse (masseria) on a private estate surrounded by lovely gardens and with a fabulous pool, it's the perfect place to kick back and relax after a morning in the kitchen. Or to enjoy a pre dinner prosecco on the terrace.





# WHEN IN TTALY

Have you ever pictured yourself in Italy? Pizza, pasta and piazze... Aperitivo, cheese and vino... Narrow winding alleyways, rolling green hills with olive groves and vineyards, ancient ruins and cultural masterpieces... and the sparkling waters of the sun-kissed Mediterranean.

### Do:

- BE YOURSELF AND BE AWARE There are pickpockets targeting tourists everywhere across Italy and particularly around tourist hot spots. So, it's a good idea to blend in.
- TRY OUT A FEW ITALIAN WORDS Buongiorno, per favore, grazie, buonasera and arrivederci are all helpful greetings. 'ciao' is used willy-nilly in Italy especially by younger folk but, it is a casual greeting, so only use it when it has been used by a local first.
- STAY COOL IN SUMMER Book a hotel with A/C (or a fan) or even a villa with pool and plan to visit outdoor tourist attractions in the cooler parts of the day. Rest indoors or in a gallery, church, museum or shady park during the heat of the day.
- EAT GELATO every day, especially in summer.
- LEAVE A TIP WITH YOUR MEAL OR APERITIF Being a waiter is a respected career choice in Italy and not a casual job. 15% is usually added to your bill in restaurants, cafes and hotels to cover service charges.
- RESPECT A DIFFERENT CULTURE Wear comfortable and appropriate clothes. Italy is a Roman Catholic country and, despite what you believe, it is respectful to cover your shoulders and knees when in a church or sacred place.
- KEEP AN OPEN MIND There are lots of Italians living in a very old country with lots of visitors, every day, in their backyards so to speak. There are often crowds - people trying to enjoy their holidays and locals going about their daily lives. It's good to stay calm and be flexible. And respectful. After all, you are on holiday.
- LIVE LA DOLCE VITA Ah the sweet life. Relax and savour your Italian experience. As they say, when in Rome...

### Don't:

- LOOK LIKE A TOURIST No visible bum-bags, passport neck wallets or a camera slung over your shoulder. There are far better and more stylish options available these days.
- BUY WATER BOTTLES IN ROME Buy one then use the many natural spring water fountains around the city, and other Italian cities too. You won't get sick and you will help the environment.
- DRIVE LIKE A TOURIST Italians drive assertively and don't follow the same road rules as in Australia. Be confident, stay on the right (overtake on the left) and keep calm. If there are no signs, go straight ahead until otherwise indicated. And don't forget to take out insurance on your rental car!
- EXPECT THE SAME AS HOME

Pasta is an entrée not a main meal. It's not drowned in sauce or liberally seasoned. Pizzas (thin crust) are often eaten whole. That's one per person not a share experience for the whole family. Café the Italian way. Milky lattes and cappucinos are enjoyed before 11am. Espressos are taken after meals and throughout the day, usually standing at the bar (it's cheaper too!). There is no skinny, soy, flat white, so save your special order for home. Wine (vino) is generally enjoyed with food, not on its own. Aperitivo is a pre-dinner drink, from 5pm and usually a biere or spirit mix enjoyed seated with a little (complimentary salty) snack. A liqueur like grappa or limoncello (or sambucca or Frangelico!) is taken after the meal as a digestive. Italians observe lunch as their main daily meal, take a siesta (nap) in summer during the heat of the day and eat dinner late... often walking, chatting and eating gelato in the cool of the evening. What a great idea!

• TRAVEL WITH TOO MUCH LUGGAGE There are many old cobbled streets, lots of stairs to climb and small lifts. Car boots are small, train compartments are crowded so if you want to save your back and energy, pack smart and light.



Eat and drink your way around Italy - savour Italian flavours and experience some of the world's best food and wine.

Italian food is made and eaten with love. Traditional recipes are passed on from generation to generation, eaten and enjoyed al fresco with family and friends. A celebration of seasonal produce, which pays homage to the traditional ways of eating and drinking - simple and authentic flavours, a feast for the five senses!

From north to south, the flavours of Italy are as diverse as they are famous. In **Northern Italy** rice, polenta, butter and game feature heavily due to availability of local produce and proximity to neighbouring countries with their rich mountaininspired cuisines.

The popular digestive *grappa* is from the northern Alps and has traditionally been used for all types of ailments... and perhaps also for warmth!

Turin and the Piedmont region is known for chocolate, including much loved Nutella, truffles and agnoletti pasta and home of the famous aperitifs, Campari and Martini and Rossi vermouth. It's also the birthplace of the now worldwide Slow Food movement.

From Veneto comes the magnificent Italian sparkling wine, prosecco, enjoyed on its own or in popular cocktail, the Bellini. A classic Venetian dish is risi e bisi (rice and peas) and arguably the world's favourite Italian dessert, tiramisu, is also Venetian.

In **Lombardy**, the specialties are minestrone risotto alla Milanese and hearty Osso Buco, best enjoyed with an aged local red wine like Valtellina Superiore.

The **Ligurian** region's food is all about the sea and quite distinct from the other northern regions. Pesto di Genovese, basil pesto sauce, is the region's claim to fame.

The central and southern regions of Italy have their own flavours and specialties. The food of Abruzzo and Puglia is cucina povera, peasant food, with simple seasonal ingredients cooked into hearty dishes that embody the produce of the land.

**Emilia Romagna** is a food lover's paradise with world famous bolognese sauce, aged balsamic vinegar, and parmigiano reggiano, real parmesan cheese found throughout the region.

When in **Tuscany**, try a famous *Florentina steak* and go wine tasting in the classic wine regions of *Chianti* and *Montepulciano*. In **Umbria**, try local delicacy, tartufo nero, black truffles, with their distinctive earthy flavour used in many dishes.

The food of the south is the soul of Italy with rustic Mediterranean flavours, rich spicy tomato sauces and almost exclusive use of olive oil in cooking. A must try dish from **Campania** is spaghetti puttanesca, made from olives, tomatoes, anchovies and capers, and the most loved Italian cheese of all, mozzarella di bufala, made from the milk of local water buffaloes. Sorrento is home of delicious limoncello liqueur made from abundant lemons grown along the Amalfi Coast.

Sicilian food has been influenced by diverse cultures over many centuries and is rich in the fruits of the land and sea. Best known dishes are vitello al Marsala and arancini, deep fried rice balls and sweet fortified Marsala wine from the west coast town of the same name. Sicilian sweets based on almonds include sweet pastry cannoli and cassata. Don't miss Sicilian ice cream, or granita, enjoyed at any time of the day.

The Island of Sardinia has its own flavours and even a liqueur of its own. Mirto, made from local berries is best enjoyed after a full Sardinian feast.

No responsibility can be taken for any cancellations for accommodation or other services which are cancelled direct by the client or direct by the client's travel consultant, regardless of whether written proof is given.

### Accommodation or other services

- · Cancellations made 15 days or more prior to arrival will incur \$150 per person, in addition to any fees charged to us by our Supplier.
- · 100% cancellation fee applies for cancellations made within 14 days prior to arrival.
- · No shows if you fail to check in at the designated hotel or service on the day booked with CIT Holidays, 100% 'no show' fee will be charged.

# **Booking Conditions** for Villas & Apartments

The following conditions apply for all villa and apartment properties unless otherwise specified at time of booking.

### **BOOKINGS**

Check in/Check out times will be advised in documentation and may differ between properties.

### **CANCELLATION/AMENDMENT FEES**

Villas: 100% cancellation applies within 30 days prior to rental commencement period.

City Apartments: 100% cancellation applies within 14 days prior to rental

### **CLEANING**

All villas and apartments are not cleaned daily during rental and final cleaning charges apply locally.

A deposit as listed, must be paid in local currency to the key holder on arrival. This amount will be refunded, less extra charges as indicated.

### **ADDITIONAL CHARGES**

Additional charges for linen, power and heating for each villa are payable in local currency.

### As a guide:

- Security deposits are payable from Euro 160 per apartment/villa.
- Power cost charges are levied from Euro 60 per apartment, per week.
- Bed and bathroom linen charges are levied from Euro 10 per person.
- Final cleaning charges are levied from Euro 30 per apartment, per week.

### CAR RENTAL IN EUROPE

Once a vehicle is collected, no refunds will be given for any unused car rental days. Car rental prices do not include fuel, oil, extra charges for additional drivers or young driver surcharges, airport and/or railway station pick up surcharges or one way fees, unless specified.

Specific car types cannot be guaranteed; all vehicles are reserved by group only. If a specific group is not available from the depot upon pick up, then the next available group will be provided, at no additional charge.

Additional items such as GPS, roof racks or baby seats must be reserved at the time of booking and paid direct. By law, in certain countries children up to the age of 12 years must have a baby/child seat.

Upon collection, a refundable security deposit by credit card to cover unauthorised rental extension and petrol deposit. You are liable for petrol charges if you do not return your vehicle with a full tank - petrol rates from the car rental company may be higher than those available outside their depot. Car rental companies will hold a deposit for all rentals to be paid locally.

### **DRIVING IN EUROPE**

Vehicles rented cannot be taken into Eastern Europe and Croatia (additional conditions apply to car rental in Austria). Cars collected on mainland Britain, but delivery is in Northern Ireland - a one way drop off fee will apply. A one way from Britain to Europe is not allowed. A one way from Britain to the Republic of Ireland is not allowed. In Ireland one way drop off fees apply to certain locations. In Europe no one way fees apply when collection and delivery of the vehicle is within the same country. One way rentals are allowed between countries but are subject to additional fees.

## Important Information

CIT Holidays recommend that you plan your requirements carefully, and avoid changes to your itinerary once lodged with your travel agent, airline provider or CIT Holidays. Hotel locations and descriptions: Please note that maps in this brochure are not to scale and are provided only as a guide to locations.

Conditions of hotel 'Special Offers': All special offers indicated are provided by individual hotels, subject to the manager's discretion.

Free nights: Where 'free nights' are offered, for example - stay 4 nights, pay 3 - only 1 'free' night is applicable per stay. Free nights are not accumulative and must be consecutive nights (unless otherwise stated).

Special offers: Where different 'special offers' are stated against an individual hotel, only one of these offers can be applied.

Honeymooners/anniversary offers: Details of honeymooners or anniversary stays must be provided at the time of booking. No special offer benefits will be received should these details not be included in the original booking details from CIT Holidays.

Hotel check in/check out times: Check in times are from 2.00pm subject to your room being available upon arrival. If you wish to check in earlier, we suggest that you pre-book your accommodation from the night prior to your arrival. Check out time is usually between 10.00am and 11.00am.
